

# Project Description



### Project 1304 Bomb Squad

ABA's proposal for the NYPD Bomb Squad building envisages a new headquarters that pairs innovative design with modest forms of construction to create secure spaces that at once feel open and light while providing for a variety of functions.

Raised 15 feet off of the ground to remain resilient to floodwaters, the building is loosely programmed to permit maximum flexibility for space usage both now and in the future. The plan effectively separates secure and visitor areas while maintaining visual connectivity and openness. A large elevator has dual functions for movement of freight and ADA access; keys or keycards allow access to the secure storage area. Security-enabled sliding garage doors allow vehicles to enter the building for loading and unloading at the elevator.

Built in a similar way to a parking garage, our design uses precast componentry. The concrete doubletee structure we are showing is an economical form of construction that can be sized to allow for significant dead or live loads, and can be erected quickly. The vertical loads are carried by precast concrete columns and beams, and walls are sized for CMU construction.

A variegated finned building skin attaches to the concrete structure and defines engaging façades while baffling light for reduced solar heat gain. With such a façade system, spacing can be varied for maximum privacy or maximum view, or levels in between.


On the ground level, the building




skin creates an enclosed, secure (but not climate controlled) space that may be used for parking, short term storage, and flexible covered work areas.


Light monitors (skylight volumes) at the roof raise above a power-generating solar array to provide diffuse natural daylighting.





Site Plan
